The 1980s gave rise to the fast growing "Christian rock and metal" scene, and WHITECROSS was the premiere group leading the way.

Founded by guitarist Rex Carroll, their early sound was often compared to Ratt; they have enjoyed a very long run of popularity with a world-wide fan base.

In the beginning, WHITECROSS toured continuously from about 1988 to 1994 with an average of 150 dates a year, establishing and building the live connection with their fans, and they won three Dove Awards for "Metal Album of the Year" and "Hard Music Recorded Song of the Year.

Rex Carroll left in 1994 due to burnout and health issues. However, in 2000 they reformed at the Cornerstone festival, drawing about 6,000 people to their comeback show. Since then, they have performed festivals and short tours all the way until 2021 and beyond.

They have performed in the USA, all over South America, and Europe including the UK, Switzerland, Germany, and the Netherlands. In 2019 they made their longest journey, performing in Nagaland, India.

In 2021 they have recruited new lead vocalist David Roberts, re-vitalizing the sound for a new full-length album currently in the works.

Finally, they have signed with Darkstar Records for recording, and Ten13Entertainment for tour dates.
